Field Landman Seminars are a real success!

AAPL's membership and education departments continue to support the association's outreach initiative to the industry's field landmen by coordinating Field Landman Seminars with the help of local associations. In April, May and June, AAPL hosted nine events that drew over 900 attendees, and nearly 45 percent of registrants were nonmembers. So far in 2011, seminars have been held in Bakersfield, CA; Greeley, CO; Kenedy, TX; Nacogdoches, TX; Oklahoma City, OK; Pearsall, TX; Roosevelt, UT; Russellville, AR; Warren, OH and Williamsport, PA.
